## SUCCESS STORY:

Andreia was referred to Peaslee Tech by the Kansas Department for Children and Families. A young, single mother with an infant and a toddler, Andreia enrolled in the Pharmacy Tech program where she excelled. Andreia successfully completed her program and was hired by a pharmaceutical company in a position that allowed her to work from home and care for her children. Within the first year, Andreia became a supervisor and was training other employees. By her second year, Andreia was a regional manager and returned to Peaslee to recruit Pharmacy Technician students for her company. By 2023, she had secured a job making 90K and believes she would not have received that offer if she had not received her Pharmacy Tech certification from Peaslee.
